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



<u>Tips on Role Alignment</u>

- 1. Your life statement will help you focus more clearly on your life assignment.
- 2. Celebrate other people's accomplishments.
- 3. Don't seek validation to affirm your life statement. Aggressively trust the work of the Holy Spirit to teach you how to fulfill your life statement.
- 4. Ingrain your life statement into your thinking, your memory and your actions.
- 5. Your life statement becomes your personal mantle (glory, cloak, inner attributes) and defines your role in the Body of Christ.

SESSION 2:

BRINGING OTHERS ON THE JOURNEY

Opening Discussion: Read the Statement

Read to yourself:

A person doesn't have to be an expert on something to lend credibility to a subject. You don't have to be the expert disciple to show another person the next step in their spiritual walk with God. You don't have to be a financial whiz to show someone how to manage one week's income. *You simply have to be willing to help someone take the next step in his or her personal and spiritual development.* If you can help people develop their lives and participate in the Kingdom harvest, you'll have done what Jesus was telling his disciples to pray for. That way you'll never have to work alone.

<u>Work</u> – working with people requires good communication of the "how" and the "why".

<u>Replicate</u> – do the process of *Show* and *Work* and depend on the Holy Spirit to empower.



Going Deeper: Scripture definitions for winning at work

(Colossians 3:22)

<u>Bondservants</u> is a metaphor defined as one who gives himself up to another's will those whose service is used by Christ in extending and advancing his cause among men (blueletterbible.org).

- <u>Earthly Masters:</u> he to whom a person or thing belongs, about which he has power of deciding; master, lord. (In modern day definitions, this is a boss or manager ...not a slave master or owner of people.)
- <u>Not by way of eye service</u>: service performed [only] under the master's eyes, for the master's eye usually stimulates to greater diligence and his absence, on the other hand, renders sluggish. (This talks about working hard only when the boss is watching)
- <u>As people pleasers:</u> studying to please man, courting the favour of men (this may be "office politics")
- <u>But with sincerity of heart:</u> denotes the center of all physical and spiritual life (this is our attitude towards our work...are we fully committed or just counting the hours till the weekend? The best employees and bosses are committed whole-heartedly because they really work for God.)
- <u>Fearing the Lord:</u> to reverence, venerate, to treat with deference or reverential obedience. (We live to give honor to God in all areas of our lives. There is no divide between secular/sacred when we are children of God.)

SOLUTIONS TO COMMON LIFE ISSUES:

<u>Problem:</u> Someone won't communicate during conflict <u>Solution:</u> Calm emotions, set meeting time, get a witness if necessary, look for both people to win

<u>Problem:</u> Someone is always running late <u>Solution:</u> Discuss time management issues, emphasize how it shows a lack of respect, start without them

<u>Problem:</u> Someone says they will be there but does not show up <u>Solution:</u> Discuss what you expect when someone gives their word, ask if they really want to be part of this project/ministry, ask them what makes them excited about something, plug them in there

<u>Problem:</u> Someone starts something but doesn't finish <u>Solution:</u> See if they need help, discuss their time commitments elsewhere, ask if they fear failure of completion, farm out responsibilities to others who are willing to help, discuss Jesus' model of Show, Work, Replicate

SESSION 4:

THE AGGRESSIVE SURRENDER OF INFLUENTIAL LEADERSHIP

Opening Question: What does it take to learn total trust?

Scripture Reading:

Isaiah 26:3 - You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. (ESV)

Meaning of Trust:

Main Idea (Teaching):

Reflection: Applying the Teaching Points

Tips to strengthen surrender and trust:

Redefine your finish line. God is not done writing your story. Your mental finish line may be God's starting line.

Let God author your dreams. Release the seeds of your dreams into the hands of God. Fruit only comes through death of the seed.

Trust the work of the Holy Spirit in people who answer to you. Release responsibility and trust your people to complete. Equip them as if you expect success, not failure.

Trust the work of the Holy Spirit in the people you answer to. God has placed them in your life for a reason; to *sharpen*, to *sand*, or to *strengthen*.

Release your right to drive your life. Give God the ability to steer you into new things. Don't be afraid to start over.



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Prayer Focus:

Trust Application: Trust requires discernment of activity - do what YOU can, let God do what HE can.

Trusting God in your finances:

2 Corinthians 10:13-16 - But we will not boast beyond limits, but will boast only with regard to the area of influence God assigned to us, to reach even to you. For we are not overextending ourselves, as though we did not reach you. For we were the first to come all the way to you with the gospel of Christ.We do not boast beyond limit in the labors of others. But our hope is that as your faith increases, our area of influence among you may be greatly enlarged, so that we may preach the gospel in lands beyond you, without boasting of work already done in another's area of influence.

Definition:

<u>Influence</u>

 A definitely bounded or fixed space within the limits of which one's power of influence is confined
 One's sphere of activity

Reflection:

- ✓ Is it possible to make a big difference in everyday living?



Conclusion: You can reach people right in front of you through compassion and evangelism.

- 1. Compassion helps restore dignity to the broken.
- 2. Evangelism brings good news to others.
- 3. Influence works when you are present in the places that need salt and light..

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JESUS' MODEL OF LEADERSHIP

<u>Show</u>

Jesus showed us step-by-step discipleship while working with his disciples. Shortly after calling them to follow him¹, he went throughout the countryside preaching the Good News and healing people of disease. During that time, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount, healed a man with leprosy, healed a centurion's servant, healed Peter's mother-in-law, delivered people from demons, calmed a storm with words, cast a multitude of demons out of two people, healed a paralytic, confronted religious leaders, recruited a tax collector to join his team of disciples, hung out with "sinners", healed a woman when she touched his outer garment, raised a young girl from the dead, healed two blind men, and "went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness."²

The greatest thing Jesus showed his disciples during his ministry immediately followed all of the signs and wonders. In verses 36-38 of Matthew 9, Jesus had compassion on the crowd of people because they were harassed like sheep without a shepherd. He instructed his disciples to **pray for workers to join the harvest** because of the great need. Jesus demonstrated (showed) what needed to be done but he told them why they needed to

bring other people on the Kingdom journey. Jesus accomplished phenomenal signs and wonders. But, He knew his physical (human) limitations and showed us the way of changing the world through <u>multiplication of laborers</u>.

Jesus first **showed** his disciples what the Kingdom looked like through his actions. When you bring someone along, you first need to show them what needs to be done, while at the same time explaining why. The work that you do for the Kingdom of God should do two things: advance the Kingdom, and motivate people to join the work of the Kingdom.

<u>Work</u>

Jesus provided orientation before sending his disciples to minister. The second step in gathering people along for the ride is to **work** with them. It is your job to instruct, communicate expectations, provide training, and encourage others to do their very best. Simply sending people to go do stuff is not adequate and is a set-up for failure. Jesus took the time to carefully instruct his disciples after he showed them examples of Kingdom work. If we want to create workers that stick to the harvest, we'll need to **show** them good works and then **work** with them through good training.

Jesus communicated these things to the disciples:

- Who they were to work with (audience)
- What they were to say (message)
- What they were to do (action)
- What they were to take with them (supplies)
- What they were to expect (potential reaction from their audience)



• Encouragement that He was with them (power for accomplishing the task)

Jesus took the most time to discuss the last two points, as they were the most important for the disciples to internalize. They needed to know what to expect and why they were doing the tasks. And, they needed to know that Jesus would be with them through it all.

If you can communicate these things to people who you work with, you can accomplish the same things that Jesus did with his disciples. If you provide good training, people will gain confidence to do Kingdom **work** and come back excited about the opportunity that was given them.

Replicate

Jesus wasted little time repeating the process with other people who came to hear him speak. It wasn't that Jesus suddenly had a new class of disciples; he simply repeated the message of the Kingdom to the hearers with the intention to build the Kingdom. Replication and discipleship stalls when people begin to protect their own interests. Only God provides the increase and growth in any person's life or project's process. As believers and followers of Christ, we must continue to seek out those who have not heard the Good News so they can hear and potentially be doers of the Word.

The process of discipleship sustains itself when people take action to reach others who are in need. **Discipleship is not sustained by what a person knows, it is by what a person does with that knowledge.** Those who know God's heart realize that with a great harvest, **many laborers** need to be developed. You can show someone what you do for the Kingdom of God and it doesn't have to be a ministry position. A life in the



marketplace or in a social sector carries just as much eternal significance as one in church ministry, when it is God's assignment. You simply need to determine what you can show someone else as an example of Kingdom work. Once you know that, you work with the people that God gives you. Finally, you replicate the process as God brings new people into your life.

Lean heavily on the Holy Spirit for direction, guidance, instruction and ultimately, empowerment. If you are willing to be a vessel that God works through, He will empower you to help others participate in the working of God's Kingdom on this earth.

Teaching: Application – applying Biblical principles to every-day life

Read:

James 1:2 - But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

Remember these points:

- All Biblical application should be in line with the fruit of the Holy Spirit and the love of God.
- Biblical application usually follows the principles of a story/teaching. (Example trusting God when things are hard, obeying God when asked to do something difficult, or being brave)
- Bible application is not always following a literal outcome of a Bible story (Example building an ark, killing a giant, or putting mud in someone's eyes)



INCREASING YOUR PRAYER LIFE

Luke 11:1-4 Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation." (ESV)

A Prayer Structure: topics of daily prayer:

Hallowed be Your Name - praise the name of Jesus

Your Kingdom Come – may your Kingdom be reflected on this earth (love, kindness, compassion, power, repentance)

Give us Our Daily Bread – thank you for your provision. Continue to provide for us.


Forgive us Our Sins – take account of your actions/attitudes and lack of trust.

SESSION 1: WHAT I CAN DO

Assignment prior to session – Read chapters 1-7

Opening Questions:

Where are you from and what makes that unique? If you could vacation anywhere in the world, where would it be?

Scripture Reading:

Hebrews 11:1-6 (ESV, blueletterbible.org)

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the people of old received their commendation. By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Discussion Questions:

- What was your main takeaway from chapters 1-7?
- Is it hard for you to let go of things? Why or why not?
- Have you ever lost hope in a situation? How did you regain it?
- How can you live with the assurance that God has been where He's leading you?
- Are there times in your life when your belief is limited towards God? How can we get to the place of having unlimited belief in what God is doing?
- How do you manage your own tendencies to do your own thing and forget about following God? Are there things we can do to improve our ability to follow Him?
- What's the best way to manage our will and focus it towards submitting to the Holy Spirit?

Application Point: Write your action steps below.



LEADER NOTES:

General recommendations for all sessions:

Plan for an hour of group time including fellowship, snacks and discussion. Your guests can linger after the discussion for fellowship. Narrowing the time of the small group provides flexibility for those who have tighter schedules. If your structured group time consistently exceeds an hour, attendees may begin to feel a little worn out by the process.

Schedule Example:

- 7pm Guest Arrive
- 7pm 7:15pm Gather snacks, visit and gather in main room
- 7:15pm Begin discussion (watch video if applicable, read scripture, go through questions)
- 7:45pm Talk about action steps, what will each member do to apply this session's discussion? Watch closing video, if applicable.
- 8:00pm Close in prayer

During discussion times, try to encourage conversation for all. In most groups, you'll have a dynamic of attendees that include, people who like to talk, people who like to listen and people who love to talk. Make sure that many voices are heard, not just one...and that includes the facilitator. J

Provide snacks and encourage your attendees to bring snacks. This is a subtle invitation for buy-in to the group. A successful small group provides opportunity for all people to participate.

As a facilitator, use your life experiences. Stories communicate life principles more effectively than trying to teach a list of points. Don't be preachy.

Have fun. Being influential can be strengthened with humor. Laughter brings many people together.

Specific recommendations for Session 1:

Go through the questions that are applicable. If you try to answer every discussion question with all of the attendees in your group, you'll be in session for hours.

The goal of session 1 is to help people understand that actions matter. What we do to facilitate surrender to the Holy Spirit provides room for the Holy Spirit to work in us.

Make sure each attendee has a copy of the Student Guide. The box of action steps is for each attendee to actually write down what they will do. This can also provide a step of accountability for the group. You can determine if it is applicable for people to share what their next step will be.

Some other thoughts:

- Consider asking a member of the group to facilitate the next session
- Feel free to emphasize discussion on a certain chapter that speaks to you
- Keep the end goal in mind; a serving project or intentional influence. This is what you build towards.
- Above all, pray that God will help each attendee realize the importance of the Holy Spirit for his or her life.



SESSION 2: WHAT GOD WILL DO

Assignment prior to session - Read chapters 8-15

Opening Question:

What is your idea of a perfect job? What has been your best experience this year?

Scripture Reading:

Isaiah 26:3-4 (ESV)

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD GOD is an everlasting rock.

Discussion Questions:

- What was your main takeaway from chapters 8-15?
- If you could change one thing about your trust, what would it be?
- How can the Holy Spirit help you trust God for all He is worth?
- Describe some benefits you've experienced by completely trusting God.
- How would you encourage someone, who may be struggling with doubt, to trust the work of the Holy Spirit?

Application Point: Write your action steps in the boxes below.

General recommendations for all sessions:

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Specific recommendations for Session 2:

Go through the questions that are applicable. You may be able to hit every question in this session, if not, use the ones that apply.

The goal of session 2 is to help people see God's involvement in everyday life. This session may be a little more introspective because it deals with our trust towards God. Trust is a deeply personal decision. Some people in your group may struggle with trust because of trauma or betrayal. Be sensitive to the needs of your group.

Make sure each attendee has a copy of the Student Guide. The box of action steps is for each attendee to actually write down what they will do. This can also provide a step of accountability for the group. You can determine if it is applicable for people to share what their next step will be. (Continued on next page)



Other Thoughts:

- 1. Consider asking another (different) person to facilitate session 3.
- 2. This session may vary in length depending upon the depth of your discussion. Be prepared for these scenarios, ending early or going a little late.

SESSION 3: WHAT I MUST OVERCOME

Assignment – Read chapters 16-22

Opening Question:

- · Describe a favorite childhood memory.
- What has been the greatest challenge that you have overcome?

Scripture Reading:

Romans 8:8-14 (ESV)

Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you. So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

Discussion Questions:

- What was your main takeaway from chapters 16-22?
- Why do you think it is hard to overcome "self"?
- Why do you think many people never tap into the fullness of God's calling for them?
- How can we connect with the power of the Holy Spirit to overcome obstacles to surrender?
- Can surrender help us overcome sin? How?
- Describe how you would talk to someone trying to please God with his or her own efforts, rather than surrender.

General recommendations for all sessions:

Plan for an hour of group time including fellowship, snacks and discussion. Your guests can linger after the discussion for fellowship. Narrowing the time of the small group provides flexibility for those who have tighter schedules. If your structured group time consistently exceeds an hour, attendees may begin to feel a little worn out by the process.

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Specific recommendations for Session 3:

Go through the questions that are applicable. These questions may be a little easier to discuss because of concrete examples of overcoming actions of self. Gauge the discussion and keep an eye on the clock.

The goal of session 3 is to help people overcome common obstacles. Everyone struggles in some way, helping people realize they are not alone in the struggle will help them see victory. Also, help people realize that God is available to help us through the work of the Holy Spirit. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Other Thoughts:

- 1. You may want to discuss options of serving together. At some point, you'll need to identify the opportunity to serve as a group. Or, if you continue meeting, you can discuss how God uses each person in their daily lives. Influence is developed through work and serving. Actions need to accompany faith.
- 2. Use this session to encourage attendees of God's faithfulness and relational support. Overcoming obstacles is easier when people help us. By now, your group may be developing a deeper bond with one another.

Opening Question:

1 Corinthians 13:8-13 (ESV)

Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Discussion Questions:

(Continued Service Opportunities for a Small Group)

Some of the best ways to increase your influence is to serve in places where no one else wants to go. You can make a difference in dark places if you are willing to shine your light. The Holy Spirit is the light in us and when we give room for the Spirit to work, great things can happen.

Here are some ideas for increasing your influence through service:

Public Schools

- · Mentoring programs.
- · Literacy development, reading programs.
- Betterment projects (painting, cleaning, building).
- Small outreach events (free haircuts, backpacks or shoes).

Foster Care

- Locate and serve group homes (if applicable) in your area.
- Take classes for respite care.
- Develop programs or training for youth who are aging out of the foster care system.

Poverty

- Work with a local urban church, assisting them in <u>their</u> mission of reaching people.
- Connect with a shelter or rescue mission and seek ways to serve.
- Find a food bank and help them secure quality, nutritious food.

Marketplace

- Do your job better than anyone else.
- Look for additional training to become a better employee.
- Build your management education so you can work better with other people.
- Begin developing that entrepreneurial idea you've been holding in your heart.

Family

- Establish a consistent devotional routine. (Prayer and Scripture reading)
- Spend quantity time with your family, reduce time watching TV, Netflix or Hulu.
- Find ways to serve together. (See options above)



Your small group can take any of these options and do a project once a month. As you enter into a life of service, serving becomes more natural and effective. God will work through you when you're willing to extend yourself in obedience to Him. He works powerfully through us to make a difference in the world around us. With that in mind, go change the world.
